The History and Archive Committee the of Castellorizian Association of NSW is a sub-committee of our Association. Our team put on its third exhibition, "Castellorizian Migration Stories". The committee sourced photos from families who migrated to Australia from our island and accompanied them with the oral history of a family that had never been recorded before. We recorded over 50 stories and presented them at the Kudos Gallery in Paddington as well as displaying original passports, disembarkation documents, and manifests. We also filmed a minidocumentary interviewing families about the journey of their parents. Our stories will be compiled into a book that will be sold once completed. The exhibition was accompanied by traditional Cassie songs of migration and dancing. The committee will continue to source more stories and invite community members to contact us so their stories can be included in our publication.

#### News from Western Australia:

**School Sanitation Project** Whilst on Castellorizo in late 2016, Prof Byron Kakulas became aware that the not-for-profit body "Drasi" (Action) Kastellorizo was calling for assistance to meet the cost of the work to improve the situation of the school toilets. The required work at the school on Castellorizo included upgrading the antiquated 'hole in the ground' type toilets with pedestals, repair of the plumbing (sewerage overflows in winter), new wash basins, fixing of the leaking roof, repair of the internal woodwork, including new doors and windows, adding paving externally and painting, inside and outside. The proposed project was also to include the installation of a new additional toilet to be shared by the School Teachers and the Church of St Constantine and Helene.

On Byron's return, he approached our association and a fund raising sub-committee was formed with Byron appointed as Chairperson. The project required approximately **\$20,000** to be raised (quotes were obtained) and was raised in a very short time-frame thanks to the numerous forthcoming donors. I can now report that the toilet improvements have already been completed so they could be operational by Easter. A great effort by all persons involved!

Saint Constantine and Saint Helene

Saint Constantine was born in the year 273A.D. He was the son of Constantius Chlorus, Ruler of Gaul, and Saint Helene, a deeply religious woman. Saint Constantine became an army officer and won many battles. Much later he became sole ruler of the Roman Empire. He showed great tolerance for Christianity, primarily because of his mother, Saint Helene, and because he had seen the Sign of the Cross in the sky prior to his battle with Maxentius.

Saint Helene at the age of eighty, made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Her mission was to discover the cross on which Christ was crucified. She had seen the place where she would find the cross in her dreams. Tradition claims that on her way to the Holy Land, she sought shelter from the heavy seas and storms on Kastellorizo. To thank the Lord for protecting her, Saint Helene built the original church where the church of Saint Constantine and Saint Helene now stands. Later, to honour her visit, a gold coin was minted, showing Saint Constantine and Saint Helene holding the cross. Many of these coins are still in circulation all over the world.

# The feast day of Saint Constantine and Saint Helene is celebrated on 21 May.

Congratulations to everyone who will celebrate their Name Day on this very special day.
